The Adopt-a-Highway program started in 1984, when James Evans, an engineer for the Texas Department of Transportation, noticed litter blowing out of the back of a pickup truck he was following in Tyler, Texas. Concerned about the increasing cost to the government of keeping roadways clean, Evans soon began asking community groups to volunteer to pick up trash along designated sections of local highways.

RidersUSA adopted a part of Interstate 17, north of Phoenix heading to Flagstaff, 10 years ago and we continue to work this stretch of highway today which used to be called Jack Ass Acres (1 Block East of I17 on New River Road) Our mile of roadway to maintain starts at exit # 232 and lasts for one mile going north. The Adopt-a-Highway program offers several benefits to its communities. It provides a clean environment, gives civic pride to the community, serves as a reminder not to litter and saves tax-

"The importance of getting out to vote for Prop. 105"

The following article is directed more towards City of Phoenix voters. However, the results of the upcoming City of Phoenix "Special Election" will affect every Arizonan to some degree or another both economically and politically.

With the City of Phoenix holding "Special Elections" on the last week of August every year is problematic. These inconvenient elections are purposefully scheduled at a time when only a small percentage of Phoenix voters actually participate. Many are on vacation and engaged in various summer activities. The majority of those who appear to be engaged are left of center voters and activists who apparently never leave City boundaries to seek relief from the summer heat. They are determined to make life

miserable for the rest of us for years to come by getting measures passed or rejected during the summer doldrums.

Attempts have been made to move these "special elections" to coincide with our November 4th general elections when a more diverse array of voters are home. It certainly makes sense to combine two election days into one. It saves the taxpayers a boatload of money and allows for voters with opposing points of view to cast their vote as well. Liberal City of Phoenix officials resist this "common sense" approach because it is simply easier to pass leftist agenda items in August than it is to do so in the November General Elections. This is how another proposition (prop 104) got passed on August 25, 2015. It allowed for the additional taxation of nearly 32 billion dollars over the next 31 years to be imposed upon taxpayers in funding the expansion of the debacle known as "Light Rail". This "Social Experiment" has been shown to be an abject failure. Studies show that approximately 1% of Phoenix residents use this antiquated system of people moving at a cost of nearly \$140 million dollars per mile of track. For \$32 billion dollars, every family in Phoenix could be allocated a new car with funds left over for substantial road improvements!

A resolve to this blunder has been introduced in another ballot initiative to be voted upon on August 27, 2019. It is Proposition 105. If passed, it will halt construction of any further expansion of Light Rail with monies slated for expansion going directly into road infrastructure improvements. It would be wonderful to see our streets and highways widened, potholes repaired, shaded bus pullouts constructed and expanded routes for a state of the art bus fleet!

We need to stop "throwing good money after bad" and pursue more "realistic" goals in improving our infrastructure. Phoenix has been and will always be a "car, and truck appropriate" area. Light Rail is an idealistic concept with little to no practical application in an area where the population is spread too thin over a large geographic area. This "special election" is important. We literally can't afford to blow this one off! In whatever voting method you have chosen, please vote a resounding "YES" on Proposition 105!!!
